Our Campus Health and Safety Guidestar: The safety, health, and best interests of our students, faculty, staff, and families will lead how and where we learn and operate. Our belief in our mission and our fifty years of experience and expertise will ensure the quality and high standards of our student learning experiences, design, parent supports, and professional development of our faculty, staff, and adult learners, so that we can continue our mission.

The School is making extensive efforts to make the environment as safe as possible for all students and employees. We are using the <u>NJ state</u> <u>guidelines</u> and <u>CDC guidelines</u> as our touchstone and will consistently monitor the status of the pandemic and continue to update this Health & Safety plan as needed based on these guidelines. Our policy seeks to ensure maximum risk reduction through multiple mitigation efforts and should be seen holistically. Our strategies to reduce risk of transmission of the Covid-19 virus include:

1) pre-screening; 2) screening; 3) social distancing; 4) cohorting; 5) masking; 6) hygiene; 7) disinfection 8) illness & isolation, and 9) testing

1	Pre-Screening	<ul> <li>All health forms need to be received by the health office no later than two days before the child begins. No exceptions. All immunizations must be up to date. All required <u>medications</u> must be in the health office two days prior to the child's start date.</li> </ul>
		<ul> <li>Attendance will be taken daily and reported to the main office. If a child will be absent, we ask parents to inform the school by emailing their child's name to <u>absences@princetonmontessori.org</u> and including a reason for the absence, i.e, sickness, vacation, family event, etc. Absence notifications will be forwarded to the correct child's conference teacher.</li> </ul>
		<ul> <li>To protect the health of all of our community and to prevent the spread of infection, parents must report to the school immediately if the child or any person in the child's household has or is suspected to have COVID-19, or has come into close contact with someone who has a confirmed positive case of COVID-19. State and local guidelines will be followed and confidentiality will be protected to the greatest extent possible.</li> </ul>
		• Faculty/staff: PMonts is in compliance with NJ Governor's Order 253, and can confirm all faculty and staff are fully-vaccinated. Faculty/staff must report to the school immediately if they or any person in their

2	Screening	<ul> <li>Children: Families should conduct a self-screen at home each morning to assess their child's health and determine if they are well enough to attend school or camp for the day. Temperature checks should be conducted each morning AT HOME as part of the self-screen and any child with a fever (temperature above 100.4°F) should remain at home. Children with the following COVID-19 compatible symptoms should be kept at home and seek advice from their pediatrician:</li> </ul>

		• <b>Faculty/staff:</b> Faculty and staff will conduct a self-screen each morning to determine if they are well enough to be in the presence of children. Faculty and staff should follow same guidelines as outlined above for students and should remain at home if <b>at least two</b> of the following symptoms are present: fever (measured above 100.4), chills, rigors (shivers), myalgia (muscle aches), headache, sore throat, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea, fatigue, congestion or runny nose; <b>OR at least one</b> of the following symptoms: cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, new olfactory disorder, new taste disorder.
		• <b>Travel</b> - We follow all CDC and NJ DOH guidelines for quarantining after travel for both vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals. Note that these guidelines change frequently so please consult these guidelines before making your travel plans. In many cases, there is a mandatory quarantine period for return from travel. When consulting travel guidelines, remember that children who have not received the vaccine are considered unvaccinated individuals.
3	Social Distancing	• <b>Drop off and Pick up:</b> We will continue to minimize parent presence in the building and minimize cross-class exposure during drop off and pick up times by the use of multiple entry and exit points by program. Details of each program's procedures and arrival and dismissal times are included with program-specific communication. Note that as of March 7th, we will no longer use the plexiglass dividers.

8	Illness & Isolation	Children are expected to be in good health when in school. Parents should not bring their children to school when they show any signs of illness.
		Any child who exhibits signs of illness during the day will immediately be brought to the health office for further evaluation and isolation. If the child exhibits a fever or is deemed to be too ill to remain at school, a parent will be called to pick the child up. The child will remain in the health office, isolated from other students, until a parent can arrive. Parents are asked to ensure they have someone on their contact list that can be at the school to pick up within 30 minutes.
		Students with a temperature over 100.4°F (38°C) will be sent home from school and will need to remain home and be fever-free, without fever-reducing medication, for 24 hours before returning to school.
